

# Ladino Clover

*Trifolium repens*



**High yielding variegated clover with great vitamin, mineral, and protein content.**

Ladino clover is very winter hardy and prefers well drained silt loam and clay soils with a pH of 6-7. It will not thrive in saline or alkaline soils. Ladino stems lie on the surface of the soil; and under favorable conditions, roots may form at each node. A ladino stem may grow from 2 to 4 feet in length during a single growing season, which will allow stands to thicken quickly. Ladino is also good for soil building alone or in a legume mix. It is generally produced for pasture or hay, however it may be difficult to cure as hay.
